The Mental Capacity Act is a key piece of legislation for care homes as it governs much of the decision making for those residents that lack the mental capacity to consent to treatment and care. Unfortunately, many care home staff lack awareness of the relevant legal principles and the Act is not applied in practice. This is a significant problem when it comes to CQC inspections and complying with the law. This course is designed to give staff an overview of the basics of the Act and uses practical case studies to consider the application of the Act in common care home scenarios.
